FRESNO BASS CLUB MEMBERS,

The Fresno Bass Club was back at the Delta this month for two more days of brutal punishment as the bite continues to favor the fish not the fisherman.

Day one started off well for leader Tim Turner who sacked up a limit totaling 10.84 lbs., but then disaster struck as the old lower unit began to whine and cry and eventually gave way. Poor Tim had just enough left in the lower end to limp back to weigh-in. Tim jumped into the lead but knew he would never be able to make it back to those fish with his mechanical issues. Tim knew he was "screwed!"

Second place on Day 1 went to Jose Guzman. Jose weighed -in a healthy limit for 10.61 and a chance to get the big win on Day 2.

Third Place after Day 1 was Ron Red Sr. with a five fish limit that weighed 9.61 and the Day 1 big fish of 4.04.

Ron was being followed very closely by Paul Shafer with a five fish limit weighing in at 9.57 lbs. and rounding out the top five was Corey Squires with five fish weighing in at 8.67.

To say the least, most of the weights were way down from what we normally see this time of year out of the Delta. Out of 11 Day 1 limits, only two limits broke the ten-pound mark.

Day 2 was a challenge for leader Tim Turner as he could only idle around fishing close to the launch and hopes he could scratch out a limit and maybe a big bite or two. Well, that never happened, and Tim was lucky to bring in five fish on Day 2 and they only weighed 7.33 lbs., not enough to keep him on top and bring his two-day total to 18.17 lbs. This moved Tim from first to fourth.

Jose Guzman stayed in contention and was very consistent weighing in a limit on Day 2 for 9.32 lbs. giving him total weight of 19.93 lbs. and securing the second-place finish. Way to go Jose!!

Ron Red Sr. was sitting in third place after Day 1, but he was bound and determined to move up the leader board. On Day 2, Ron weighed in the biggest limit of the tournament topping the scales at 13.75 lbs. anchored by the tournaments Big Fish of 4.09 and almost a clone of his Day 1 big fish. Ron was the only angler to catch not just one, but two fish

in the 4 lbs. class. This limit gave Ron a grand total of 23.36 lbs. for two days and vaulted him into the lead and eventually to the win.

Corey Squires was consistent and came in Day 2 with a limit weighing 9.66 giving him a grand total of 18.27 lbs. and securing the 3rd place finish.

Paul Shafer brought in "skinny" five fish limit on Day 2 that weighed in at 6.64 and dropping him out of the top five.

Mark Corrente who had a "measly" 7.50 lbs. on Day 1, worked a little harder on Day 2 and brought in another five fish limit that weighed a respectable 9.77 lbs. Mark's two-day total of 17.27 lbs. moved him into fifth place.

Ron Red said he caught a total of six keepers on both Saturday and Sunday. Ron went to the south Delta on Saturday and his first fish was caught on a spinnerbait and the remainder of his limit was caught on Senkos. On Day 2, Ron went north on the Mokelumne. Once again, Ron's first fish was on a spinnerbait and ended up being big fish of the tournament and the remainder of his keepers came on a Senko.



Jose Guzman said he drop-shotted a 7" Margarita Mutilator on both days near Tower Park to catch both of his limits.



Corey Squires said he cranked and threw topwater in the main river channel on both days. He said he covered a lot of water, but the better fish would not commit to his topwater.(No Pictures Available)

Tim Turner said he went to the West Delta on Day 1 and caught then flipping. On Day 2, with a bad lower unit, Tim stayed close to B&W and caught a limit on chatterbaits and a neko rig.



Rounding out the top five, Mark Corrente spent both of his days throwing a variety of baits in the Little Potato Slough area and the Mokelumne River. Mark said he covered a ton of water to catch his fish on a "variety of baits." (No pictures available)
